From Pastor Caroline. . .

Dear Friends,

Once the season of Epiphany ends, a new season begins in the Christian year. It is the season of Lent, followed by Easter. I know while we are seeing landscapes of cold, blustery days, it may seem a bit absurd to realize that Lent is just around the corner.

Yes, it's true, Lent will begin during the month of February. It starts on February 17th, Ash Wednesday and continues through April 3rd, the day before we celebrate the risen Christ on Easter Sunday. Recently, I was searching/discerning what to do for a Lenten study. You may wonder why Lent is so important and what I chose for this year's Lenten study. The title is "Who Is This Man?" written by John Ortberg.

During the season of Lent, we usually travel with Jesus on his last days of his ministry here on earth, working tirelessly with his disciples to heal the sick, feed the hungry, provide instruction about God and how to treat one another, and reach out with love, compassion, and forgiveness to those who seek him.

"Like Advent, Lent is a time to open the doors of our hearts a little wider and understand our Lord a little deeper, so that when Good Friday and eventually Easter comes, it is not just another day at church but an opportunity to receive the overflowing of graces God has to offer. Lent is also an opportunity for spiritual reflection and to contemplate what our Lord really did for us on the Cross. But ultimately, the purpose of Lent does not stop at sadness and despair - it points us to the hope of the Resurrection."

For me, Lent is a time to grow closer and learn more about who Jesus is, journey with him and be thankful for his tremendous love – giving his life so that we may be forgiven and reconnect with God. Every time I travelled to the Holy Land, I was moved when we would go to Jerusalem, because we would walk down the Mount of Olives to the garden of Gethsemane. We would go to one of the places where Jesus was tortured, walk the way of sorrows (the Via Dolorosa) and to Golgotha – the place of his crucifixion.

In this study, we will learn about the impact Jesus had and continues to have on our world. John Ortberg wrote that "Jesus' life and teaching simply drew people to follow him. He made history by starting in a humble place, in a spirit of love and acceptance, and allowing each person space to respond." Come, let us journey together and grow deeper in our understanding of Jesus and his influence on our daily lives.

A copy of the January Letter with Church Pause Extended

January 12, 2021

Dear Church Family,

Due to the current upsurge in the COVID -19 virus in our community, Rotterdam UMC's pause of in-person worship attendance and building activities will continue through at least February 13th. The infection rate (9.1%) and hospitalization ICU rates (81% full) continue to rise in our area, and we continue to see more and more prayer requests for family members of our church family. We know everyone really wants to get back to in-person services and "normal" life, but we continue to hold onto an abundance of caution to try to keep everyone in our church community safe, and in addition, help with the burden that our frontline healthcare workers are being challenged to meet. We will reassess what the environment is in our area again in early February and based on the conditions found at that time, make another decision regarding the pause of in-service worship and building use.

Pastor Caroline, Charito and some key volunteers have agreed to continue to live stream at https://www.facebook.com/RotterdamUMC/ and record a full church service, not only on Sundays, but for Ash Wednesday on February 17th as well. We realize this does not reach everyone, but hopefully, it will reach most of our church family who wish to view the service. (And remember, you don't need a Facebook account to watch the service after it's been live streamed. Just type in the link above on your computer.) We want to thank these individuals for stepping up to reach out and continue the mission of our church.

In addition, we will be continuing the pause on all building activities, including in-person meetings, and all Scout meetings through at least February 13th. Wonderland Preschool runs on the Mohonasen schedule and their own NYS Health guidelines as a preschool and is currently holding in-person classes.

We realize the pandemic has been a difficult time for all and we pray everyone stays safe and well.



Lenten Bible Study - "Who is this Man?"

Jesus' impact on our world is highly unlikely, widely inescapable, largely unknown, and decidedly double-edged. It is unlikely in light of the severe limitations of his earthly life; it is inescapable because of the range of impact; it is unknown because history doesn't connect dots; and it is doubled-edged because his followers have wreaked so much havoc, often in his name.

He is history's most familiar figure, yet he is the man no one knows. His impact on the world is immense and non-accidental. From the Dark Ages to Post-Modernity he is the Man who won't go away. And yet . . .you can miss him in historical lists for many reasons, maybe the most obvious being the way he lived his life. He did not loudly and demonstrably defend



his movement in the spirit of a rising political or military leader. He did not lay out a case that history would judge his brand of belief superior in all future books.

His life and teaching simply drew people to follow him. He made history by starting in a humble place, in a spirit of love and acceptance, and allowing each person space to respond. His vision of life continues to haunt and challenge humanity. His influence has swept over history bringing inspiration to what has happened in art, science, government, medicine, and education; he has taught humans about dignity, compassion, forgiveness, and hope.

Join us as we learn more about Jesus. The Book study will start the week after Ash Wednesday (week of February 22nd) and the day of the week, time and method (via Zoom or inperson), will be decided later. Scripture for Today TODAY SALVATION HAS COME TO THIS HOUSE.


Luke 19:9*b*






