Praise in the Park: A Celebration of Laity and Community at a Spirit-Filled Gathering

Dear Friends,

As the days grow long and the sun warms our hearts and our parks, we are invited into a sacred rhythm of worship beyond the familiar walls of our sanctuaries. This summer, our United Methodist churches are uniting on August 10th at 11:00 AM for "Praise in the Park," a laity-led worship service



at the River Road Park Pavilion in Niskayuna, followed by a joyful picnic. As your pastor, I am filled with gratitude and awe at the ways God's Spirit can move among us during this special gathering. I invite you to join our siblings in Christ and receive the blessings that we can experience at this event. Following the Worship service, we will hold a fellowship picnic. Activities will include access to a playground and crafts designed for children.

There is something profoundly moving about worshiping outdoors, surrounded by the beauty of creation. As we set up around the picnic tables in the pavilion, we will find ourselves in good company: songbirds echoing our hymns, trees lifting their branches in silent praise, and sunlight dappling the faces of friends and neighbors. Their willingness to step forward, plan, and lead our worship reflects the biblical truth that all believers are ministers in Christ's body.

You are cordially invited to join me as the Rotterdam UMC community gathers with other area United Methodist churches to commemorate this occasion. Let us come together in fellowship and unity to celebrate our connectionalism and reinforce the bonds within our community.

Sunday School Update



As illustrated, Income from Pledges and Fundraisers drop off in Q3, summer months. Without Brooks or Wonderland income during these months, cash flow can be low, making our pledges all the more needed to cover expenses.


Matthew 4:19




