Autumn Reflections: Embracing the Season of Change

Dear Friends,

It is difficult to realize that our summer has come to an end as September marks the beginning of a new season. During this time, students return to school, vacations conclude, and new schedules or routines begin.

As the days grow shorter and the temperatures begin to drop, we find ourselves entering the gentle embrace of autumn. The changing leaves, adorned in fiery reds, warm golds, and deep oranges, flutter to the ground—a gentle testimony to the beauty of transition. It is in this season of transformation that we are reminded, both by the rhythms of nature and the teachings of Scripture, that change is not only inevitable but sacred.

When we pause and observe the world around us, we cannot help but marvel at the lessons embedded in creation itself. Fall is a time when the earth prepares for rest. The trees, once bursting with green vitality, now let go of their leaves, surrendering to a process that is necessary for their continued growth. Let us also remember that the harvest is not ours alone. God calls us to share our abundance, to provide for those who hunger and thirst, whether physically, emotionally, or spiritually. As part of our commitment to addressing physical hunger, we will be hosting another Drive-thru Food Drive on Saturday, September 13 from 10am–2pm—our Harvest for Hunger Food Drive. We kindly request your support in helping us restock the Food Pantry, ensuring this ministry can continue to serve those in need.

As we journey through this autumn together, may we open our hearts to the lessons of the season. May we give thanks for the harvest, let go with trust, rest in stillness, gather in community, and look ahead with hope. For the God who paints the trees with glory and ushers in each new season is the same God who walks with us—day by day, step by step—into the future.

May the peace of Christ be with you this autumn, and may you find blessings abundant in every falling leaf and every golden sunset.



Scripture for Today PUT OUT INTO DEEP WATER, AND LET DOWN THE NETS FOR A CATCH.


Luke 5:4
