



(Please include the angel number and name somewhere on the shipped package (packing slip) or send Caryn an email with the description and angel name) and Caryn will wrap it, label it and deliver it to church. **Do NOT ship gifts to RUMC.**

All Angel gifts are due back by December 14.

You can drop your angel gift in the back of church during service on Sunday, or Monday thru Friday when Wonderland is downstairs. (9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.) When you return your gift, please wrap it and attach a gift tag that says only "Merry Christmas + (Name of Angel) i.e. Merry Christmas Laura. The Food Gift Cards should only be dropped off to Melissa on Sundays during service or to the office on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m.




RUMC Food Pantry
